

Cleveland State University Distinguished Emeritus Faculty Honorary Degree Nomination Guidelines

Cleveland State University will recognize its accomplished emeritus faculty through awarding of a Distinguished Emeritus Faculty Honorary Degree. The Honorary Degree is the highest award given by the University. The awarding of the Honorary Degree recognizes an individual of distinction, one who has achieved the highest level of skill and competence in his/her discipline. The awarding of an Honorary Degree is also an expression of the ideals of the University reflected in the recipients who are awarded, bringing honor and distinction to the University, as well as the individual.

Honorary degrees are typically awarded at the May and December commencement ceremonies and occasionally, at the Cleveland Marshall College of Law Commencement. No more than three honorary degrees should be awarded at each of the commencement ceremonies. One honorary degree may be awarded to a distinguished emeritus faculty annually.

Suggested candidates to receive a Distinguished Emeritus Faculty Honorary Degree from Cleveland State University are those with the following characteristics:

- Has attained CSU emeritus faculty status**
- Has extraordinary achievements in teaching, research and service at Cleveland State University**
- Serves as an aspirational and inspirational role model for the university**
